Work Experience – Students can attend work experience with a qualified bricklayer and gain valuable experience and a look into the daily activities you would undertake as a bricklayer. This experience can lead to future apprenticeship opportunity.

School Based Apprenticeship – Students in Years 11 and 12 can combine paid work, training, and school. This is a nationally recognised qualification that may count as credit towards your Year 12 result.

Pre-Apprenticeship Course – Some TAFE colleges conduct full or part-time pre- apprenticeship courses which deliver Units of Competency within the Certificate III Bricklaying/Blocklaying qualification.

Full-time Apprenticeship – It offers you the opportunity to study and earn an income while undertaking a qualification - Get paid to learn the trade on the job.
